 - Parties can appoint any person as mediator upon agreement. The results of mediation will be treated in line with court judgments.
 - The committee observed that the definition of 'international mediation' in the bill and the provisions of the Singaporean Convention are incorporated into the bill. "The Committee observes that the purpose of the Singapore Convention is to facilitate international trade and commerce by enabling disputing

 - Cervical cancer in India ranks as the second-most frequent cancer among women between 15 and 44 years of age.
 - Cervical cancer is a common sexually transmitted infection. Long-lasting infection with certain types of HPV is the main cause of cervical cancer.
 - Worldwide, cervical cancer is the second most common cancer type and the second most common cause of cancer death in women of reproductive age (15–44). India accounts for about a fifth of the global burden, with 1.23 lakh cases and around 67,000 deaths per year according to the World Health Organization's International Agency for Research on Cancer (IARC-WHO).
 - Two vaccines licensed globally are available in India — a quadrivalent vaccine (Gardasil, from Merck) and a bivalent vaccine (Cervarix, from

GlaxoSmithKline). Each dose costs Rs 2,800 per dose (Gradasil) or Rs 3,299 (Cervarix).

- Although HPV vaccination was introduced in 2008, it has yet to be included in the national immunisation programme.
- 5- (c)
 - As the largest optical telescope in space, its greatly improved infrared resolution and sensitivity allows it to view objects too old, distant, or faint for the Hubble Space Telescope. This is expected to enable a broad range of investigations across the fields of astronomy and cosmology, such as observation of the first stars and the formation of the first galaxies, and detailed atmospheric characterization of potentially habitable exoplanets.
- 6- (c)
 - The streamlining of labour laws has been a work in progress, with the Centre notifying four broad labour codes to replace 29 sets of labour laws: The Code on Wages, 2019; The Industrial Relations Code, 2020; The Code on Social Security, 2020; and The Occupational Safety, Health and Working Conditions Code, 2020.
 - With labour being a concurrent subject, both the Centre and states

have to frame laws and rules. While Parliament cleared the four labour codes in 2020, and the Centre prepublished the draft rules for all four codes, some state governments are yet to complete the process.

- Youth in the age group of 15-29 years comprise 27.2 per cent of the population for 2021, which is expected to decrease to 22.7 by 2036.
- Bihar and Uttar Pradesh long with Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh and Rajasthan, are projected to have over half (52 per cent) of the country's youth.
- The proportion of the population aged under 15 years is projected to decline, the elderly in the population is expected to increase, the report said. "The youth population is expected to increase initially but will start to decline in the latter half of 2011-2036 period. The total youth population increased from 222.7 million in 1991 to 333.4 million in 2011 and is projected to reach 371.4 million by 2021 and, thereafter, decrease to 345.5 million by 2036," the report said.

- All interactions in the universe are a result of four fundamental forces acting on particles — strong nuclear force, weak nuclear force, electromagnetic force and gravitation.
- Gravitational force, besides not being fully integrated and understood by particle physicists, is extremely weak.
 For one thing, a particle that interacts so weakly becomes rather elusive to detect. This is because interactions from other known particles could drown out signals of dark matter particles.
