





- Focus on lunar glass beads formed by:
 - Volcanic activity 🌋 Impact events 💥
- The ages of volcanic samples range from 116–135 million years old. Evidence suggests they have a volcanic origin, despite overlapping ages with impact beads.

Researchers focused on lunar glass beads — small glass piec formed by volcanic activity or impact events like when rocks from space smash the moon's surface.





Road to verdict

The fact check unit of Ministry of Electronics and IT has faced criticism since it was established on April 6, 2023. The case against the Centre's amendment has concluded after over a year. **Highlights**:

April 10, 2023: Satirist Kunal Kamra files a petition in Bombay HC against the amendments to the Act, calling them "arbitrary, violating fundamental rights of speech and expression and vague"; Editors Guild of India and the Internet Freedom Foundation join the plea later April 24: IT Rules

April 24: 11 Rules Amendment does not seem to offer protection to parody and satire, observes Bombay HC Jan. 31, 2024: Court delivers a split verdict with Justice Patel favouring the petitioners and Justice Gokhale upholding the

amendment Feb. 8: The case is placed

Justice Chandurkar

Key Provisions of the 2023 Rules

Fact-Checking Authority

Allowed government to establish a fact-checking body Required social media intermediaries to monitor flagged content

① Content Removal Timeline

Content flagged by FCU to be removed within 36 hours Retention of "safe harbour" protection contingent on compliance

- The amended Rule 3(1)(b)(v) specifically required social media intermediaries to make "reasonable efforts" to prevent users from uploading or transmitting any content □ flagged by the Centre's FCU as misinformation.
- Such □flagged content would have to be taken down within 36 hours if the intermediaries wanted to retain their "safe harbour" protection a form of legal immunity against any third-party content hosted by them



Split Verdict Analysis

Justice Patel's View

- Rules promote censorship
- Lack of procedural safeguards
- Government acts as "judge in its own cause"
- Justice Gokhale's Perspective
 - Government's role in providing accurate information
 - Combatting misinformation without hindering legitimate criticism

Overview of Paper Retractions

Definition: Retractions occur when a scientific paper is removed from literature due to significant errors or misconduct.

Honest Errors vs. Misconduct:

Honest errors are often forgiven.

Deliberate manipulation results in severe repercussions. Notable Cases:



John Darsee had over 80 retractions for inaccuracies. Nobel laureates are not exempt from scrutiny.

Recent Increases:

Retractions have surged; 10,000 papers were retracted in 2023 alone.

Significant growth in retractions noted during the pandemic due to expedited processes.

Retraction Index:

Defined as the number of retractions multiplied by 1,000 and divided by total published articles.

Higher retraction rates seen in high-impact journals.




